Speaking at the Ad-Hoc Housing Diversity Study Committee Meeting After the public comment period has been opened, any person wishing to address the Ad-Hoc Housing Diversity Study Committee shall signify a desire to speak by raising their hand. When recognized by the chair, the speaker shall give their name and address or name and local affiliation, if the affiliation is relevant, prior to making comments. All remarks should be addressed to the Ad-Hoc Housing Diversity Study Committee. Comments shall be limited to three minutes per person; however, the time may be extended by majority vote of the committee members present. The time for public comment at the beginning of the meeting is limited to 15 minutes. This time may be extended by a majority vote of the committee members present. The time for public comment at the end of the meeting shall be sufficient for any member of the public to speak for 3 minutes. Time may be extended by the chair or vote of committee for public comment to take place at any time during the meeting. The chair will allow questions to all committee members and committee members are also allowed to ask questions to members of public. The chair may decline to recognize any person who has already spoken on the same agenda item and may call on speakers in a manner so as to balance debate. Once the Ad-Hoc Housing Diversity Study Committee has begun its deliberations on an item, no person shall be permitted to address the Ad-Hoc Housing Diversity Study Committee on such item.
